Transfers:

Please remember that membership transfers across regions require both local coordinators, both regional coordinators and my approval.

For ease of Tracking please do not entitle your email "transfer" but rather put your name and cam number in the title. That prevents it from getting mixed with 60 other emails of the same title and allows everyone to track and get the transfer through the system in the shortest amount of time. Also please remember that while a national lock or review is not an absolute requirement for a transfer, its a very very good idea so that somewhere down the line you are not looking for records from years back and regions past.

To be absolutely clear. If you move physically to another location (outside your previous chapter/domain/region or nation), or will be out of place for an extended period of time then you have 90 days to begin the transfer process. I will consider approval of transfers no more than 30 days from the physical move date, so that members are not dealing with their membership transfer at the same time that they are dealing with the stress of the actual move but no sooner. This applies to all US members.

Plagiarism:

Copying someone's answers on an ordeal is cheating. People are expelled for Plagiarism every year in schools around the country, and really there is no need to cheat on an open book, no time limit test. When you are caught there will be disciplinary action.

Prestige Reviews

"I'll go up for my next lock/MC review right before [insert major convention name here]".... news flash - everyone else had that same thought. Please remember that your local, regional and national coordinators are volunteers who are donating their free time. Traditionally the busiest times for reviews are immediately preceding USCC and ICC. On average national reviews over 18 logs a month. Considering that the average log consists of 200 individual lines, and takes about 2 hours to complete, that equates to 34 hours for an average month. That's a full work week every month. Peak months can range from 26-30 reviews a month, quickly getting up to 60+ hours.

Also remember:

If a coordinator performing a review feels that the member's past behavior does not warrant this level of reward, that coordinator may decline to award the Member Class even if sufficient prestige has been earned (subject to appeal, of course). If this is done, the coordinator must also provide reasons for the decision, suggest a course of action to correct the issues, and a time frame after which the member may be reconsidered. Decisions of this nature should be used as an opportunity for improvement, not as a punishment.

Prestige Reporting

A. Donations - please ensure to include what you donate to the organization in your prestige activity report to your coordinator and on your logs. Coordinator's please include this information in your report. We need to ensure that everyone is getting the correct awards for helping out,

B. List Mods - Remember that there are different reporting requirements for cam-server lists and non-cam-server lists. Please refer to the USMH for each to ensure that they are properly awarded and you have no delays come review time.

Summer 2008 Transportation Prestige

Effective June 16, 2008 through Sept 30, 2008 the following change is in place regarding the organizational service line item of transportation: This ends this month.

Transporting 3+ members (Number to include the driver) to a sanctioned event, 5 per trip, max 10 a month, with no set distance requirement. Please remember that 1 trip is there and back from an event. Just an update that we are now back to normal award guidelines for transportation.

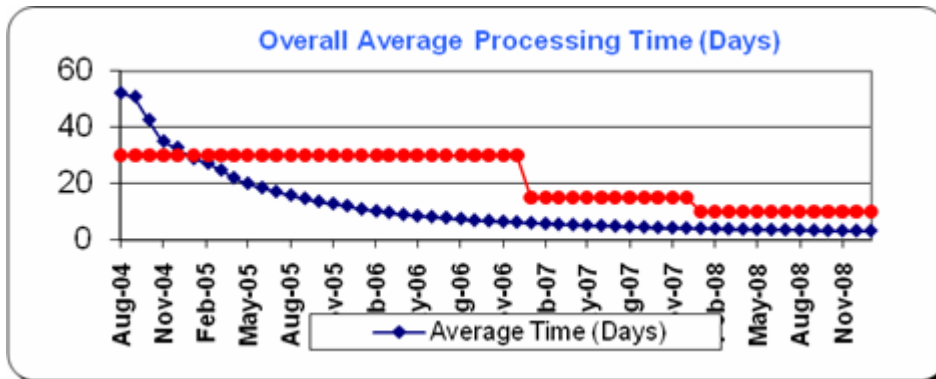

Professionalism and Courtesy

A good portion of my time has been spent on conflict resolution between members, disciplinary actions, mediation and investigation. Members should exercise some discretion when calling for appeals. Not every decision that affects you negatively should be appealed. Only those decisions which are clearly incorrect in the way they were made are likely to be reversed. An officer simply exercising her own best judgment in a way other than you feel you would rule, or even differently than her supervising officer, is not grounds to overturn a decision. So long as it is a reasonable course of action, that decision will stand. To appeal a decision, you must submit a letter of appeal within 30 days of the decision to the original officer, the officer(s) to whom the decision is appealed, and to your direct coordinator.

Members are expected to be courteous and cordial whenever they are not in character. Compliments should be as frequent as possible and criticism should be constructive. Members who have a personal issue with another member have a responsibility to handle it calmly through the dispute resolution procedures. Dishonesty is disrespectful. Members shall be honest in their dealings with other members. Members should avoid spreading information at Camarilla functions and over Camarilla forums that is hurtful to other members, particularly information that is secondhand or potentially incorrect.

Also, if something you are about to do out-of-character, isn't appropriate for where you work or where you go to school, then chances are its not appropriate within the organization. Everyone will have people at their job or in everyday life that they disagree with. That's a simple fact. However we expect that our members... behave as

adults. Even if you disagree with another member it is expected that you can still behave correctly when in social situations. Please remember that the first stage of conflict resolution is to calmly discuss the matter with the other member. If you need to step-back and calm down, use the 24hr rule but remember to discuss with the member next.

Formal Complaints:

Do not exist. They have not been a part of the Camarilla process for almost 5 years now.

Conflict Resolution:

Sometimes a member may have a disagreement with another member, or may have concerns about an officer's decision or general performance. The Camarilla offers members ways to voice these concerns and seek resolution in a constructive manner

The following steps can guide you through any interpersonal or organizational disputes between yourself and a fellow member or officer

- The 24-Hour Rule (when necessary)
- Open Discussion
- Mediation
- Formal Hearing
- Appeal (if needed)

Please note that this process is not used simply to object to a specific decision made by an officer of the club, or in cases where you may suspect deliberate unethical behavior. To appeal a specific decision, use the appeals process described in this handbook. If you wish to report specific violations of the rules or club policy, report them to the appropriate officer who will then decide whether to initiate an investigation

Appeals:

From the USMH - Members should exercise some discretion when calling for appeals. Not every decision that affects you negatively should be appealed. Only those decisions which are clearly incorrect in the way they were made are likely to be reversed. An officer simply exercising her own best judgment in a way other than you feel you would rule, or even differently than her supervising officer, is not grounds to overturn a decision. So long as it is a reasonable course of action, that decision will stand.

Suspension and Membership:

Please note that time spent as not a valid member [Expired] does not count toward time suspended as part of a disciplinary action. Meaning if you have a 4 month suspension, and expire after 2 months when you renew you still have 2 months suspension to serve even if that renewal date is after the two additional month timeframe.

CURRENT QUESTIONS

Q: How many months should I keep an expired member on my report before dropping them?

A: Typically I would say no more than 60 days [2 report cycles] and would indicate this in those reports with information on attempting to contact the member to resolve.

Q. If a member earns prestige in another region or at a level higher than the domain, should that prestige be reported in the local domain report thus creating duplication in reporting? Or is it acceptable to have mismatches in prestige totals?

Not sure I'm following this question - the process is that

A. Member reports their activities to their coordinator

B. coordinator awards [those within their scope] and reports in their status report

C. Member inputs the award amount on their prestige log

So if all of the activities are reported then there should be no issue in filling in the totals whenever released.

LAST MONTHS QUESTIONS

Question: Why do some members have WW Cam numbers?

A. WW numbers are associated with White Wolf Employees.

Questions: Do you know where it is actually listed that item donations need to be itemized in order for the coordinator to award proper prestige. I have a member (st) arguing that itemization is not required specifically in the handbook and therefore he doesn't have to provide it. I'd like to provide a reference rather than just saying "do it or else".

A. In the description of the line item "Donating items as part of a Camarilla charity drive" and "Donating needed materials to the Camarilla" it states 1-10 per item its impossible to award based on per item, if you do not know what that item is. If they are not willing to list specifically what was donated, so that you can award a fair amount, then you are within your authority to award nothing. If there are additional questions please direct the member directly to me.

Q: What is the policy for awarding prestige for ones Significant Other for work done or reports sent in? Do they need to be approved by the next higher level in the chain or can one award it themselves?

A: I would recommend it to avoid even the appearance of Conflict of Interest.

Question: We are working on securing a site for a future GoTM. When we talked to the people in charge they asked us about Event Insurance. Is this something that is provided by the club or is it something we have to purchase at a domain level?

Questions: Domain requested a name change and voted on changing the name. How do I go about applying that?

A. Send it up to the USNC through your regional officers. Once the RC and RST have approved, I will review. Once approved the CRD can be updated with the new names (the same process should be followed for domain borders)

Q: Does the NC hold office hours on IRC or other location and if so when and where?

A. Not currently, though I am on IRC personally a good bit. Its something we had discussed but scheduling a realistic time fair to all time zones is difficult, if not impossible.

Q: The DST/DC/VST/CC have reported that several of them have not received their awards for on time reporting, who can they contact about this?

A: Officers should contact their regional supervising office (STs to RST and Cs to RC). It is from that level which the recommendations are made for on-time reporting awards.
