FAQs:

I don't have a credit or debit card, am I hosed?

Discuss with your CC/DC/RC or another member to help you out if you don't have a credit/debit card. Though I believe it would be quite a rare situation now-a-days.

I can't afford to donate cash right now, can I still help out?

Absolutely, ask your friends, co-workers, or even perfect strangers to donate, your awards would fall under the 5 points per hour for Volunteer time as part of a Camarilla charity drive and make sure that you report your time and success to your direct coordinator so that they can send it up.

The charity seems a natural fit for a gaming group, and also will give us another trial run of the cash donation drive for evaluation.

Prestige/MC & Reviews

A couple questions have come up in the last little bit about how to report your prestige activities to your coordinator. Just a reminder that the system is:

1. Perform activity
2. Report activity to your the awarding coordinator or recommending storyteller
3. Awarding coordinator issues the amounts in the report
4. Enter awards on your prestige log in the month earned (not month reported)

Many times issues seem to be cropping up when members do not report the activities or wait for the award before putting the item and an amount on their prestige log. The simplest way to report your activities is via email, that way you maintain a sent copy which is neatly time and date stamped. Plus the coordinator or storyteller is less likely to forget someone or something when they have a written record to go by. While member class is earned through accumulating prestige points, it represents much more than that. It is a symbol of dedication and service to the club and its values. When accepting a new member class, you are agreeing to serve as an example of this service and dedication to the other members of the club. The higher one's member class, the more one is expected to act as a leader, maintain a positive attitude, and set a higher standard of ethics and responsibility.

With this in mind, member class is not guaranteed to all who earn the requisite number of prestige points, and can be removed if a member abuses the privileges of their member class or consistently creates conflict within the club (outside the confines of the Camarilla global chronicle). Member class is most definitely a privilege, not a right.

Prestige Courtesans: Please be respectful of other members desire to earn prestige. I have had a couple issues where members felt that others were talking all of the prestige opportunities available in the chapter/domain setting. Supervising coordinators should occasionally ask for proof of donations, not assuming that anyone is being untrue, but to establish fair and equal awards between members for similar donations. Also per the USMH holding more than three admin positions requires NC approval (reference page 47 in the USHM - Multiple Positions - for specif details). Please keep in mind that there may be other members in your chapter/domain that might be interested in hosting games, bringing snacks or holding an office.

And finally that thought of "I'll go up for my next lock/MC review right before [insert major convention name here]".... everyone else had that same thought. Please remember that your local, regional and national coordinators are volunteers who are donating their free time. Traditionally the busiest times for reviews are immediately preceding USCC and ICC. On average national reviews over 18 logs a month. Considering that the average log consists of 200 individual lines, and take about 2 hours to complete, that equates to 34 hours for an average month. That's a full work week every month on average. Peak months can range from 26-30 reviews a month, quickly getting up to 60+ hours.

CURRENT QUESTIONS

Q. Does the Club Director post reports for those in the club to read?

A. The Club Director maintains an informational website available off of the Camarilla portion of the White Wolf site.

Q: What is a Conflict of Interest? When would be an appropriate time to use this policy? Please assist me by clarifying when it is ok to ignore this guideline. Appreciate your time on this topic, thanks.

A: A conflict of interest occurs when a reasonable person with knowledge of all the relevant facts would question the officer's impartiality on the matter. Possible sources of a conflict of interest include but are not limited to:

The presiding officer has competing professional or personal obligations or personal interests that would make it difficult to fulfill his duties fairly

An issue in which the presiding officer would receive a substantially greater benefit from one outcome than another

Direct involvement in the situation

An officer should be willing to step aside from an issue in order to present the image of impartiality and fairness." (Membership Handbook Page 77)

The key phrase is - when a reasonable person with knowledge of all the relevant facts would question the officer's impartiality on a matter. Each situation is unique, and would need to be evaluated.

Q: May I get a count from the NFA as to what income was gained for the region for GLaRE? (From GL RC)

A: Contact Chris Herr - camfinance@white-wolf.com

Q: How is insurance usually taken care of in regards to renting locations for a game? If I use my own home owners insurance or renters insurance, are there any issues I need to be aware of?

A: Insurance is handled at large events through the contract with the facility. Just as any other social gathering of friends at your home, you carry the responsibility should someone get injured on your property.

Q: To whom do the DSTs report? It is my understanding that the Domain Storytellers report to the Domain Coordinators in order to have their prestige recommendations submitted. Is this correct?

A: DSTs are required to report per the USMH. The report should be sent to both the DC (responsible for confirming prestige recommendations into actual awards) and the RST (their supervising storyteller). Naturally ST information should be controlled to only the ST chain, therefore it is acceptable for DCs to receive edited DST reports that contain the prestige recommendations, but not plotline, approval or other ST sensitive materials.

Q: When is the revised GLARE prestige going to be out?

A: New NCA has stated that other than USCC in May her next big priority is catching up on all back prestige for national conventions.

Q: Prestige for donating game snacks, etc. has always been awarded under "Donating needed materials." I have a number of members who go out of their way to burn CDs and provide soundtracks for games and events; is this a prestige-worthy activity?

A: Yes, providing the CDs remain a part of the domains equipment on-going and that no issues exist with copyright on the material. (Camarilla members should not be violating music copyright to produce CDs for use within the organization). Prestige awards should be in line with the relative cost of the blank CD.

Q: How and what does a list mod for a list on the cam server need to do to find or get awarded prestige? Have been a list mod for years and never seen any post of awards or report requirements and not been able to get approved to be on the moderator list on cammail either.

A: List Moderation prestige is awarded though the Club Directors office in combination with the Technology Department. All awards currently received are posted at http://camarilla.white-wolf.com/usnc/prestige_light/index.php?cat=18

Question: What is the policy on Disciplinary Actions and running for office after said DA? The Membership states that "once a disciplinary action has been enacted and completed, the member is back in good standing with the Camarilla and is encouraged to return to club activities immediately." How soon after a Disciplinary Action can a member be allowed to run for an elected office? Please clarify.

A: That is correct, however the MH also states (Under the election procedure) = "After the application deadline, the officer administering the election reviews the applications. The officer may remove any applications that are inappropriate. Legitimate reasons for removal of an applicant include past disciplinary actions or an applicant's unwillingness or inability to meet the minimum standards of the office"

Typically Disciplinary actions within the last year are closely reviewed during application review and may result in removal from the candidate list.

Question: When shall the Membership Handbook revisions be completed? Is any assistance needed in its completion?

A: Currently there is no solid deadline for completion of revision of the MH. Its an on-going process.

Question : As its taken way too much time to get our prestige for NERE to be official, is it possible because its only regional prestige, that I could just ok it? Its somewhat ridiculous its taking this long and my region has been very patient.

Question : Any reason why the Camarilla Council's actions have to be so secret? The recent removal of the NW RC is sort of shocking to the say the least. More so when the person responsible for the NERE prestige has the time to vote on that but not get our prestige done.

A: The reasoning for, and actions taken, were detailed to the entirety of the NW region within 72 hours of the decision. The entire process for motions to the Camarilla Council, and procedures of the Council are listed in the Membership Handbook. While I can understand the importance many members place upon prestige, in practice there are other issues of the organization which must take priority over prestige at times.

Q: There's something I've always heard, but wanted it verified. I've always been told that temporary members can earn prestige, but (obviously) can't earn MC. That is, that stuff our awesome temp members do for us is still worth prestige for them, and that it adds on to their totals when they sign up for the permanent membership. Is this how it works?

A: Per the White Wolf Camarilla site under trial memberships – A trial member may not benefit from prestige earned unless a full membership is purchased. So a trial member may earn prestige, but can not apply for MC advancement until such time that they are a full member.
